

Year 1 curriculum overview Spring Term 2016

Our topic for this half term is 'Carnival of the Animals'. The curriculum overview below roughly outlines how the different subject areas will be covered. Some activities may change or different activities may be added depending upon which areas the children choose to investigate further.

Literacy:

As readers we will read stories from other cultures including *'Why Anansi Has Eight Thin Legs'* and *'Anansi and the Talking Melon'*. We will read traditional tales and about animals and write our own Just So stories.

As writers we will write narratives about animals and create non-fiction books full of animal facts. We will learn how to use sentences with different forms and punctuate them correctly.

As speakers we will orally rehearse stories and poems, and share our writing by reading it aloud.

We will share our home learning confidently.

Maths:

As mathematicians we will practise our 'Learn It's' daily these include adding 2 and 3 to single digit numbers and counting in 2s, 5s and 10s. We will recognise coins and find totals by adding 2 or more coins. We will apply our subtraction skills by giving change. We will estimate, measure and compare length, weight and capacity. We will read the time to o'clock and half past the hour. We will know what each digit means in a 2 digit number and we will work on partitioning numbers into tens and units. We will work on adding ten to a 2 digit number.

Science:

As scientists we will identify that most living things live in habitats to which they are suited and describe how different habitats provide for their needs. We will identify and name a variety of plants and animals in their habitats including micro habitats.

We will learn about how animals obtain food and simple food chains. We will know about basic needs of animals and humans, and how to look after them, including the importance of exercise, food and hygiene.

Geography:

As geographers we will identify and locate world habitats. We will identify and find on maps and globes where animals come from in the world.

Art/Design and Technology:

As designers we will design and make healthy snacks. We will also design and make animal headdresses to wear at our carnival of the animals.

Music:

As musicians we will listen to Carnival of the Animals by Camille Saint-Saens and learn about pitch using voices and instruments.

Computing


As IT experts we will write learn how programs work by writing codes. We will use digital devices and the internet safely across the curriculum.


